The Junior League of Rochester is creating real change in Rochester by advancing social activism-focused projects that directly benefit our local community! We make a positive impact through effective action and leadership.

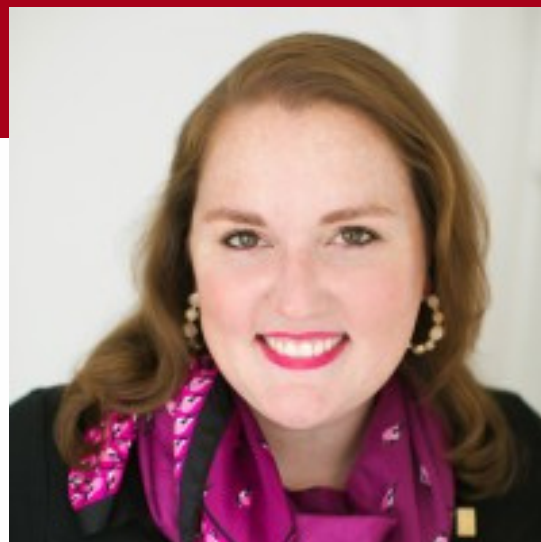
Our Local Impact

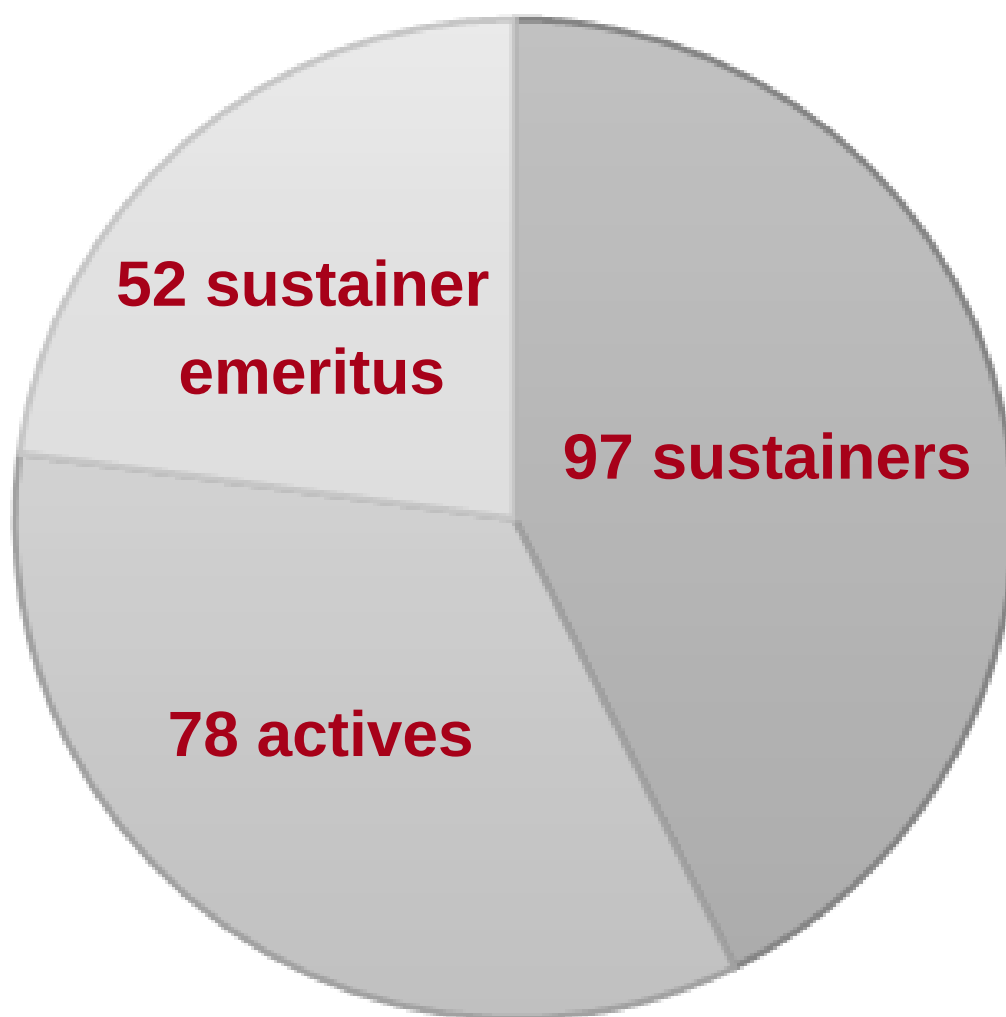

JLR 2022 DEI Annual Assessment Summary

The AJLI Annual Assessment for Diversity, Equity and Inclusion is recommended for League Chapters to assess and monitor member perceptions regarding progress in commitment to DEIB. The DEI Annual Assessment has 27 questions divided into three categories: Organizational Commitment; Embedding DEI in Operations and Member Development; and Member Commitment. It was first implemented in JLR in 2020; our 2020-2023 Strategic Plan asked us to monitor progress against that baseline. JLR has made significant improvements in several areas – particularly member development opportunities and leadership commitment – but we still have lots of room for improvement! 2022 Results are summarized below.

ORGANIZATIONAL COMMITMENT

KEEP DOING!

86% agree DEIB is a strategic priority for JLR;
90% agree Board talks passionately about DEIB

DO EVEN MORE!

25% mildly agree or disagree that JLR has a designated team empowered to lead organization-wide DEIB efforts

MEMBER COMMITMENT

KEEP DOING!

86% value JLR's inclusive & welcoming culture & climate;

93% at least mildly agree that diversity in League membership has improved

DO EVEN MORE!

43% feel that a sense of exclusion (not feeling welcomed, respected, supported or valued to fully participate) is a major factor for why members terminate membership;

64% agree their input & feedback is welcome & their voice is heard

EMBEDDING DEIB IN OPERATIONS & MEMBER DEVELOPMENT

KEEP DOING!

75% agree we communicate openly about DEIB progress & make learning opportunities available;

71% agree we intentionally create a positive, welcoming & respectful environment for all

DO EVEN MORE!

25% mildly agree or disagree that 35% agree cultural competence & DEIB mastery are leadership requisites;

46% agree we follow clearly defined goals & actions;

53% agree we have incorporated DEIB criteria into selection of community impact programs/volunteer opportunities

Notes:

- 2020 baseline had 60+ responses, while the 2022 Annual Assessment only received 28 member responses. It is critical to improve response rates in future years to ensure we're accurately capturing member perceptions regarding our progress in Diversity, Equity and Inclusion!
- Results are summarized by combining responses of "Agree" or "Strongly Agree" into totals; responses of "Mildly Agree", "Mildly Disagree", "Disagree" and "Strongly Disagree" with statements reflected are excluded from response totals, except where noted.

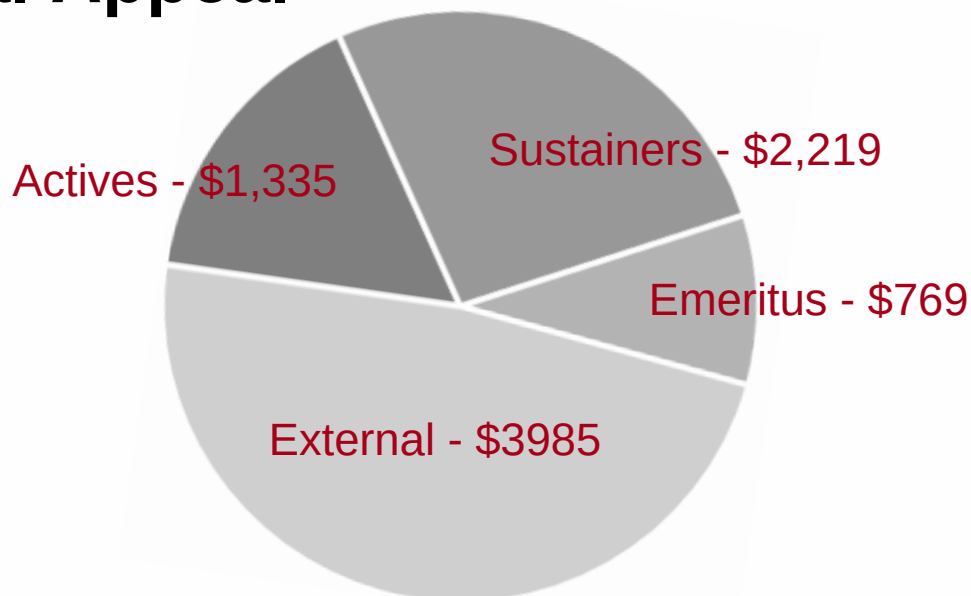

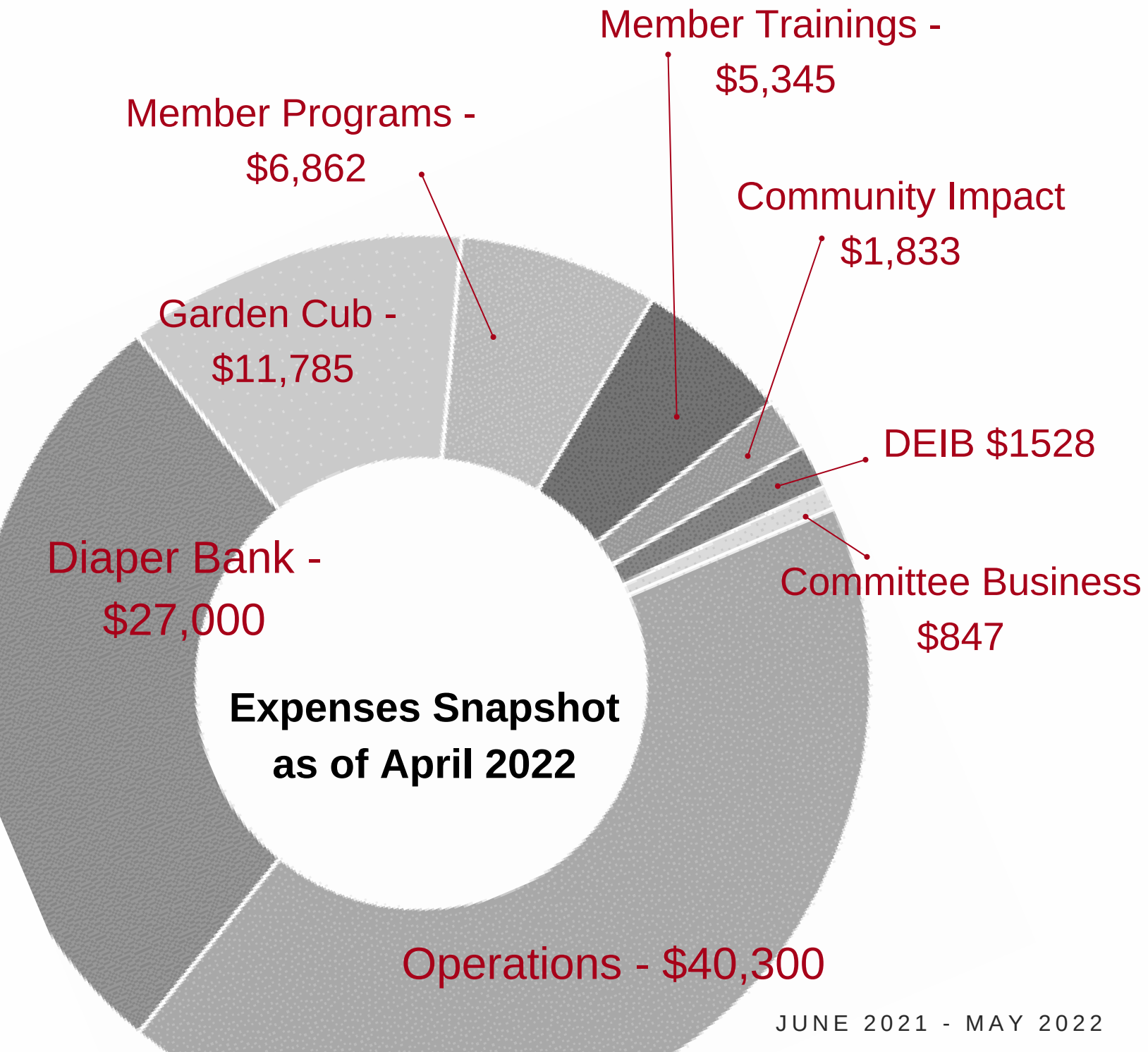


Expenses Breakdown

Diapers change lives by keeping babies healthier, reducing parental stress and making it possible for babies to attend childcare so that their adults can get to work and school. Without an adequate supply of diapers, families are left with no choice but to keep their children in dirty diapers, or re-use soiled ones. Babies who remain in a soiled diaper too long are exposed to potential health risks, such as infection and severe diaper rash. Access to sufficient diaper supply means preventing these dangerous health risks and relieving the financial burden of potential healthcare costs.

As a volunteer-run program, the JLR Diaper Bank relies on funding from individuals, foundations and businesses to operate. With more than half of children in Rochester living below the poverty line, the diaper need in our community is significant.

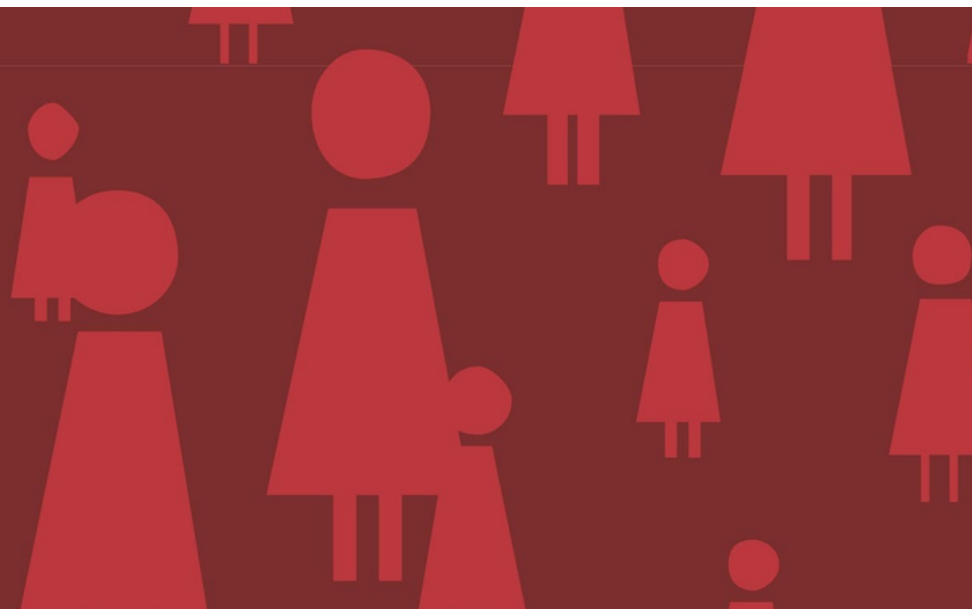

Legislative Initiatives

- Adult Survivors Act (ASA)
 - Creates a special one year look back window to allow individuals who were 18 or older when they were sexually assaulted in NYS to file a lawsuit again the person who harmed them and/or the negligent institution.
- Salary Range Transparency Law (Senate Bill S7434)
 - Prohibits employers from asking job applicants about salary expectations. Requires all employers in NYS to disclose the salary or compensation range and any benefits upon issuing a new employment opportunity.

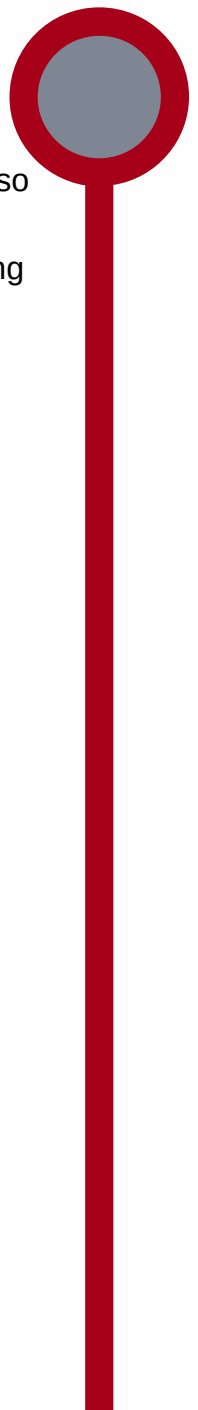

Casey has been a member of the League for 3 years. She is looking forward to serving as a Co-Chair for the first time this year and enjoys the community of members the League provides.

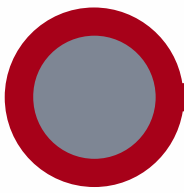

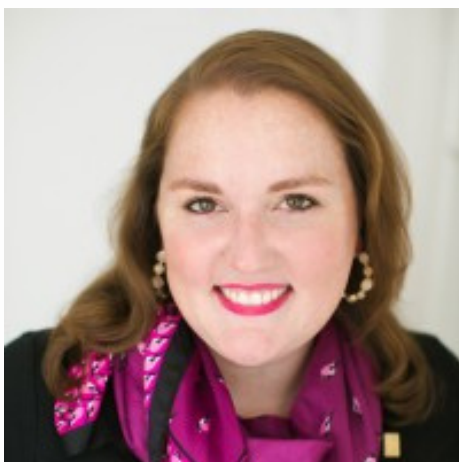
